Andy Barr has served as the U.S. Representative for Kentucky's Sixth Congressional District since January, 2013. He is a Member of the Committee on Financial Services, and is the Chairman of the Monetary Policy and Trade Subcommittee. Barr is focused on strengthening Kentucky's signature bourbon, equine, coal, agriculture and manufacturing industries, and serves as co-chair of the bipartisan Congressional Horse Caucus. He is fighting for policies that will save the country from bankruptcy, increase government accountability, and that would restore the balance of powers as intended by the founders of our nation. Congressman Barr graduated from Lexington's Henry Clay High School in 1992, earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Government and Philosophy from the University of Virginia in 1996, and received his law degree from the University of Kentucky in 2001. Pamela Brown is based in CNN's Washington, D.C. bureau and serves as the network's Justice and Supreme Court correspondent covering law enforcement, as well as issues related to the Department of Justice and the U.S. Supreme Court. Brown also serves as a key fill-in anchor for CNN Newsroom. Since joining the network in 2013, Brown has reported on several breaking news stories including the Boston marathon bombings, the Cleveland kidnappings, the historic Supreme Court same-sex marriage ruling and the San Bernardino and Brussels terrorist attacks. In 2015, Brown reported from Paris on the investigation into the terrorist killing rampage that began at the headquarters for the French newspaper, Charlie Hebdo. From Düsseldorf, Germany, she reported on the criminal investigation into the ill-fated Germanwings Flight 9525. Before shifting to the justice beat, Brown was a national correspondent reporting on a variety of topics for the network and contributed to CNN's morning program, New Day. Brown began her career at ABC7/WJLA-TV and NewsChannel8 in Washington D.C., where she became a Sunday evening anchor and an Emmy®-nominated special projects reporter covering several national and international stories. She grew up in Lexington, Ky. and holds a B.A. from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in broadcast journalism.

Elaine Chao

U.S. Secretary of Transportation

Secretary Elaine L. Chao is currently the U. S. Secretary of Transportation. This is her second cabinet position. She served as U.S. Secretary of Labor from 2001-January 2009, and is the first Asian American woman to be appointed to the President's cabinet in American history. Early in her career, she specialized in transportation financing in the private sector. She began her executive career in public service working on transportation and trade issues at the White House. She then served as Deputy Maritime Administrator, U. S. Department of Transportation; Chairman of the Federal Maritime Commission; and, Deputy Secretary of the U.S. Department of Transportation. Prior to the Department of Labor, Secretary Chao was President and Chief Executive Officer of United Way of America. Secretary Chao earned her MBA from the Harvard Business School and an economics degree from Mount Holyoke College.

Upon his election to Congress in November 2016, James Comer came to Washington ready to fight on behalf of the people of the 1st Congressional District. Comer grew up in rural Monroe County and later attended Western Kentucky University to study his lifelong passion: Agriculture. Upon graduation in 1993, Comer entered the business world, taking out a loan to purchase his first farm and dive into his career. Today that business, Comer Family Farms, is one of the largest farming operations in south central Kentucky. After his first election in 2000, Comer served for six terms as a member of the Kentucky State House. Upon being elected Kentucky's Commissioner of Agriculture in 2011, Comer cleaned up the Kentucky Department of Agriculture and promoted rural economic development by spearheading the successful effort to legalize industrial hemp and developed new branding initiatives for Kentucky farmers. **COMMITTEES:** Agriculture; Oversight and Government Reform; Small Business.

James C. Duff

Mr. Duff was appointed to the position of Director by Chief Justice John G. Roberts, Jr., and assumed the office on January 5, 2015. As Director, Duff also serves as secretary to the Judicial Conference of the United States and as a member of the board of the Federal Judicial Center. He previously served as president and CEO of the Freedom Forum and the Newseum. Before that, he served as the Director of the AO from July 2006 to September 2011. Duff is former chairman of the U.S. Supreme Court Fellows Commission and a board member of the U.S. Supreme Court Historical Society. Previously, Duff was managing partner of the Washington office of Baker, Donelson, Bearman, Caldwell & Berkowitz. Duff has represented the University of Kentucky's federal interests. As an undergraduate at Kentucky, he was a walk-on member of the basketball team. He graduated from Kentucky in 1975 magna cum laude with a bachelor's degree, Phi Beta Kappa, and with High Distinction in its honors program. He received his law degree at Georgetown University Law Center in 1981 and attended the University of Edinburgh in Scotland.

Ron Eidshaug

Congressman Brett Guthrie represents Kentucky's 2nd Congressional District. Congressman Guthrie serves on both the House Energy and Commerce (E&C) Committee and the House Committee on Education and the Workforce for the 115th Congress. Recognized for his proven leadership, he was also appointed to serve as an Assistant Whip within the Republican Conference and as a regional representative to the Republican Policy Committee. Guthrie graduated in 1987 from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point with a degree in economics and went on to serve as a Field Artillery Officer in the 101st Airborne Division – Air Assault at Fort Campbell. U.S. Representative Thomas Massie entered Congress in November 2012 after serving as Lewis County Judge Executive. Congressman Massie attended the Massachusetts Institute of Technology where he earned a Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering and a Master's Degree in Mechanical Engineering. During school, he invented a technology that enabled people to interact with computers using their sense of touch, and leveraged that technology to found SensAble Technologies, Inc., which raised over \$32 million of venture capital, created 70 jobs, and obtained 29 patents. The hardware and software he developed is now used to design automobiles, jewelry, shoes, dental prosthetics, and even reconstructive implants for wounded soldiers. Mitch McConnell is the Senate Majority Leader. Elected to that position unanimously by his Republican colleagues first in 2014 and again in 2016, he is only the second Kentuckian to ever serve as Majority Leader in the U.S. Senate. Senator McConnell previously served, again by the unanimous vote of his colleagues, as the Republican Leader from the 110th through the 113th Congresses and as the Majority Whip in the 108th and 109th Congresses. McConnell also served in leadership as chairman of the National Republican Senatorial Committee during the 1998 and 2000 election cycles. First elected to the Senate in 1984, McConnell is Kentucky's longest-serving senator and was elected to a record sixth term in 2014. McConnell graduated with honors from the University of Louisville College of Arts and Sciences, where he served as student body president. He also is a graduate of the University of Kentucky College of Law, where he was elected president of the Student Bar Association. McConnell is married to Secretary Elaine L. Chao, the 18th U.S. Secretary of Transportation. **COMMITTEES:** Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry; Appropriations; and Rules & Administration.

On February 17, 2017, the United States Senate confirmed Scott Pruitt as the 14th Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Most recently, Pruitt served as the Attorney General for Oklahoma, where he worked with neighboring state Arkansas to reach agreement to study the water quality of the Illinois River. Pruitt also led an historic water rights settlement between Oklahoma, Oklahoma City and the Choctaw and Chickasaw Tribal Nations that preserved the ecosystems of scenic lakes and rivers on native lands. He has dedicated his career to creating policy that serves the people and led the state's legal challenges against property rights intrusion, while protecting Oklahoma's natural resources and environment. Before being elected attorney general, he served eight years in the Oklahoma State Senate. After earning his Bachelor's Degree from Georgetown College and graduating from the University of Tulsa College of Law, Pruitt went into private legal practice, specializing in constitutional law.
