Partners in Plaza Roosevelt include neighbors, Habitat for Humanity of Kent County, Ferris State University, Dwelling Place, Grandville Avenue Arts & Humanities, Grand Rapids Public Schools, Hispanic Center of Western Michigan, Trinity Health and the Roosevelt Park Neighborhood Association. The development provides new GRPS dual-immersion high school, affordable housing, expanded health care facilities, arts and cultural programming, child care, community gathering space, after-school programming and other services.
